

We hope you are keeping well in these unprecedented and difficult times. Just knowing that the previous sentence is our new "hello", reminds us of how surreal our "normal" is at this time and the impact it has had on us as individuals, communities, nation, world. Our thoughts continue to stay with everyone impacted by the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Despite all that 2020 has forced us to confront, The F.I.N.D. Design continues to be resilient.

From March to May of 2020, we went into "adaptive mode" and completed 35 virtual sessions as an immediate response to the virus shutdown. To be fully transparent, we still don't know if that was admirable or foolish in such times. We did, however, understand the mental space that our girls were in having already gone through 6 months of programming. The type of services we provide are known to open girls up to vulnerabilities and complete transformations that they have never experienced before. To end abruptly in the middle of this process could have resulted in major setbacks. To give you a visual, imagine the harm and danger to the butterfly going through its metamorphosis and how dangerous it is for the process to stop midstream. And just like the butterfly and understanding this risk, we simply were unwilling to take that chance... so continued we did.

The circumstances remain unknown and unpredictable, and some determinations are not within our control. However, we will continue to stay dedicated to our girls and the community. And while we foresee some hard challenges ahead, we continue to be hopeful that the difficulties that we are forced to face, will lead to saving more lives than we, unfortunately, lost so tragically.

"F.L.Y. GIRL"

Adjective-RESILIENT

Latia was introduced to the program as a John Early Middle School referral due to being labeled as having "behavioral" challenges. From initial observations, Latia kept to herself and was not interested in the possibility of connecting with others. The familiar "go-to" of what may look like defensiveness to some that lack the cultural knowledge, was simply an internal wall that had been built from direct and indirect rooted traumas that she carried of herself and previous generations. Over the next couple of months, The F.I.N.D. Design did what it was known to do and used culturally relevant, relatable, strength-based, innovative services that applied social-emotional learning, hands-on activities, and 1:1 training and coaching to start the process of breaking down the walls of vulnerability. Over this time, it was visible that Latia started to feel a "connectedness" that allowed her to draw within her internal strengths and blossom into the young lady that we knew pre-existed. On this journey of self-discovery, she began to open up to her coaches and felt comfortable asking for support when she felt overwhelmed. We saw grades improve, confidence grow, and tools being used for positive decision making.

On March 3, 2020, a tornado ripped through our city-devastating everything in its path and destroying Latia's home where she shared with her mom, siblings, grandmother, and cousins. Everything was gone. Not able to connect with her for days, search efforts paid off as we finally located her family in Clarksville with other family members. Fortunately in our "my sister's keeper" way, we were able to aid the family with short and long term resources provided by private funds and community supporters. Additionally, the family was able to secure temporary housing and essentials.

As that wasn't enough, COVID-19 showed its head and school was canceled, yet again, forfeiting her 8th-grade festivities. The last blow came in May, when her, her little brother, and her mom was attacked by a pit-bull shortly after moving into her new home. The dog bit her over 7x's causing deep wounds and hospitalization for all parties involved. Because of hospital restraints for COVID-19, she could only reach out to limited individuals. Her "go-to" was her F.L.Y. Girl Coach who she knew would be there to support and comfort her during this time. Once again, we were able to connect the family to resources, such as Priest Lake Presbyterian Church, who provided additional support during this time. Through it all, Latia has continued to draw from her learned tools which expanded her knowledge of her lineage of warriors that she was standing of the shoulders on. Her strength, willingness, and fearlessness have stood the test of times as she learns to fully embrace her inner F.L.Y. Girl.

Latia aspires to finish high school, attend college, and work to help support her family.



DEMOGRAPICS

While any young girl can be a F.L.Y Girl, our participants represent the communities in Nashville in which we serve. Our programming primarily serves South Nashville. (37013,37217,37011, 37210 37212). Additionally, our services were requested in area code 37208 specially by the Metro Nashville Schools system. Research shows these area codes lack gender-specific services for girls.

COVID-19 RESPONSE















2020 will always be the year that completely changed our lives. Our services, which very foundation embraces in-person connections, were completely shut down leaving us to wonder how we would continue to provide the safe space that "our girls" had grown dependent on.

As F.L.Y. Staff do, we instantly tapped into our resilience as an organization and exhibited the tools and skills we teach weekly, "if you stay ready, you don't have to get ready". Our staff and leadership applied their creativity and was able to provide limited uninterrupted services, using a virtual platform...

During this time we were able to stay socially engaged by creating "safe zones" for weekly "checkins" that provided tools to cope with heightened anxieties, panic, sadness, and frustrations from being away from school and missing key pivotal moments such as prom, senior week festivities, and graduation.

To applaud the girls for their efforts and to teach them to embrace moments of completion, we were able to do "drive-by and drop off" graduation mini ceremonies for all of our F.L.Y. Girls. We want to give a special thanks to our sponsors. The Dan & Margaret Maddox Fund and our Big Payback Donors for sponsoring gift bags for each graduate.

We needed each other during these hard times... even from a distance. This gesture was able to serve that need as we remained #FLYGirlStrong.






REVENUE INCREASE




